What is OPDIVO + YERVOY?

OPDIVO is a prescription medicine used in combination with YERVOY to treat adults with cancer of the tube that connects the throat to the stomach (esophageal cancer) and their cancer:

- ✓ Is a type called squamous cell carcinoma, **AND**
- ✓ Cannot be removed with surgery (advanced), or
- Has spread to other parts of the body (metastatic) and you have not already had treatment for your advanced or metastatic esophageal cancer.

It is not known if OPDIVO is safe and effective in children younger than 18 years of age.

OPDIVO and YERVOY are medicines that may treat certain cancers by working with your immune system. OPDIVO and YERVOY can cause your immune system to attack normal organs and tissues in any area of your body and can affect the way they work. Some of these problems may happen more often when OPDIVO is used in combination with another therapy.

What are the serious side effects of OPDIVO® (nivolumab) + YERVOY® (ipilimumab)?

A **serious side effect** is a side effect that can sometimes become severe or life-threatening and can lead to death. They may happen anytime during treatment or even after your treatment has ended. You may have more than one of these problems at the same time.

Call or see your healthcare provider right away if you develop any new or worse signs or symptoms, including:

- lung problems
- intestinal problems
- liver problems
- hormone gland problems
- kidney problems
- skin problems
- eye problems

Problems can also happen in other organs and tissues. These are not all the signs and symptoms of immune system problems that can happen with OPDIVO and YERVOY. Call or see your healthcare provider right away for any new or worsening signs and symptoms. Getting medical help right away may help keep these problems from becoming more serious.

Additional serious side effects observed include:

- Severe infusion reactions
- Complications, including graft-versus-host disease (GVHD), of bone marrow (stem cell) transplant that uses donor stem cells (allogeneic)

The most common side effects of OPDIVO when used in combination with YERVOY include:

- feeling tired
- diarrhea
- rash
- itching
- nausea
- pain in muscles, bones, and joints
- fever
- cough

- decreased
- appetite
- vomitingstomach-area

- breath
- headache
- low thyroid hormone levels (hypothyroidism)
- constipation
- decreased weight

WHAT'S A BIOMARKER?

A **PD-L1 biomarker** is a molecule found in the body in tissues, blood, or fluid. Biomarkers may show if there is a disease or condition present. Your doctor may test you to see if you have the PD-L1 biomarker.








More people were alive on OPDIVO + YERVOY compared to chemotherapy*



In a study of 649 adults with previously untreated advanced or metastatic esophageal squamous cell cancer, 325 received OPDIVO + YERVOY and 324 received chemotherapy.* Of these, 315 adults had PD-L1 ≥1%. In this group, 158 adults received OPDIVO + YERVOY while 157 adults received chemotherapy.*





Adults with PD-L1 ≥1%

For adults with a PD-L1 biomarker ≥1%, half of the adults on **OPDIVO + YERVOY** went 4 months without their cancer spreading, growing, or getting worse compared to half who went 4.4 months without their cancer spreading, growing, or getting worse on chemotherapy.* OPDIVO + YERVOY did not reduce the risk of cancer spreading, growing, or getting worse compared to chemotherapy.*





OPDIVO and YERVOY can cause your T cells to attack healthy cells contained within organs and tissues in any area of your body and can affect the way they work. These problems can sometimes become serious or life-threatening and can lead to death, and may happen anytime during treatment or even after treatment has ended. You may have more than one of these problems at the same time. Some of these problems may happen more often when OPDIVO is used in combination with another therapy. Please see pages 9-10 for a list of possible side effects and what to look out for.

What are the serious side effects of OPDIVO® (nivolumab) + YERVOY® (ipilimumab)?

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

OPDIVO and YERVOY are 2 different medicines that are delivered into your vein through an intravenous (IV) line. On the days that you receive both medicines, you will be given separate infusions of OPDIVO and then YERVOY during the same visit.



Talk to your doctor about which treatment schedule may be right for you. These are the recommendations about treatment, timing, and dosing. Your doctor will decide how many treatments you need. Your healthcare provider will do blood tests to check you for side effects, and may treat you with corticosteroid or hormone replacement medicines, and delay or completely stop treatment if you have side effects that are severe. Be sure to talk to your healthcare team about side effects.

Frequent communication with your healthcare team is an important part of treatment. Use your appointments to let them know how you're feeling and ask any questions you may have.

See pages 9-10 for information about pregnancy, nursing, health problems, and other medicines that you should discuss with your healthcare team before starting treatment.



If you miss an appointment,

call a healthcare provider right away. Try to schedule your appointments for the same day of the week and the same time of day to make them easier to remember. It is important for you to keep all appointments with your healthcare provider.

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
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


Important Facts About OPDIVO® (nivolumab) and OPDIVO + YERVOY® (ipilimumab)

Your healthcare team can work with you to help answer any questions you may have about these medications. Keep this information in a safe place so you can refer to it before and during your treatment.

What is OPDIVO + YERVOY?

OPDIVO is a prescription medicine used in combination with YERVOY to treat adults with cancer of the tube that connects the throat to the stomach (esophageal cancer) and their cancer:

What is the most important information I should know about OPDIVO + YERVOY?

OPDIVO and YERVOY are medicines that may treat certain cancers by working with your immune system. OPDIVO and YERVOY can cause your immune system to attack normal organs and tissues in any area of your body and can affect the way they work. Some of these problems may happen more often when OPDIVO is used in combination with another therapy.



Get medical help immediately if you develop any of these signs or symptoms or they get worse. It may keep these problems from becoming more serious. Your healthcare team will check you for these problems during treatment and may treat you with corticosteroid or hormone replacement medicines. If you have severe side effects, your healthcare team may also need to delay or completely stop your treatment.

What are the serious side effects of OPDIVO + YERVOY?

A **serious side effect** is a side effect that can sometimes become severe or lifethreatening and can lead to death. They may happen anytime during treatment or even after your treatment has ended. You may have more than one of these problems at the same time.

Call or see your healthcare provider right away if you develop any new or worse signs or symptoms, including:

Lung problems – Things to look out for may include:

- new or worsening cough
- shortness of breath
- chest pain

Intestinal problems – Things to look out for may include:

- diarrhea (loose stools) or more frequent bowel movements than usual
- stools that are black, tarry, sticky, or have blood or mucus
- severe stomach-area (abdominal) pain or tenderness

Liver problems – Things to look out for may include:

- yellowing of your skin or the whites of your eyes
- severe nausea or vomiting
- pain on the right side of your stomach area (abdomen)
- dark urine (tea colored)
- bleeding or bruising more easily than normal

Hormone gland problems – Things to look out for may include:

- headaches that will not go away or unusual headaches
- eye sensitivity to light
- eye problems
- rapid heartbeat
- increased sweating
- extreme tiredness
- weight gain or weight loss
- feeling more hungry or thirsty than usual

- urinating more often than usual
- hair loss
- feeling cold
- constipation
- your voice gets deeper
- dizziness or fainting
- changes in mood or behavior, such as decreased sex drive, irritability, or forgetfulness

Kidney problems – Things to look out for may include:

- decrease in your amount of urine
- blood in your urine

- swelling of your ankles
- loss of appetite

Skin problems – Things to look out for may include:

- rash
- itching
- skin blistering or peeling
- painful sores or ulcers in the mouth or nose, throat, or genital area

Eye problems – Things to look out for may include:

- blurry vision, double vision, or other vision problems
- eye pain or redness

Problems can also happen in other organs and tissues. These are not all the signs and symptoms of immune system problems that can happen with OPDIVO and YERVOY. Call or see your healthcare provider right away for any new or worsening signs or symptoms, which may include:

- Chest pain, irregular heartbeat, shortness of breath, swelling of ankles
- Confusion, sleepiness, memory problems, changes in mood or behavior, stiff neck, balance problems, tingling or numbness of the arms or legs
- Double vision, blurry vision, sensitivity to light, eye pain, changes in eyesight
- Persistent or severe muscle pain or weakness, muscle cramps
- Low red blood cells, bruising

What are the possible side effects of OPDIVO + YERVOY?

OPDIVO + YERVOY can cause serious side effects, including:

Severe infusion reactions – Things to look out for may include:

- chills or shaking
- itching or rash
- flushing
- shortness of breath or wheezing

- dizziness
- feeling like passing out
- fever
- back or neck pain



Tell your healthcare team right away if you get these symptoms during an infusion of OPDIVO or YERVOY.

Complications, including graft-versus-host disease (GVHD), of bone marrow (stem cell) transplant that uses donor stem cells (allogeneic). These complications can be severe and can lead to death. These complications may happen if you underwent transplantation either before or after being treated with OPDIVO or YERVOY. Your healthcare provider will monitor you for these complications.

What are the most common side effects?

The most common side effects of OPDIVO when used in combination with YERVOY include:

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- diarrhea
- rash
- itching
- nausea
- pain in muscles, bones, and joints
- fever

- cough
- decreased appetite
- vomiting
- stomach-area (abdominal) pain
- shortness of breath
- upper respiratory tract infection

- headache
- low thyroid hormone levels (hypothyroidism)
- constipation
- decreased weight
- dizziness

These are not all the possible side effects. **Talk to your healthcare team** or pharmacist for more information. You are encouraged to report side effects of prescription drugs to the FDA. Call 1-800-FDA-1088.

What should I discuss with my healthcare team before receiving OPDIVO or YERVOY?



Tell your healthcare provider about all your medical conditions, including if you:

- have immune system problems such as Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis, or lupus
- have received an organ transplant
- have received or plan to receive a stem cell transplant that uses donor stem cells (allogeneic)
- have received radiation treatment to your chest area in the past and have received other medicines that are like OPDIVO
- have a condition that affects your nervous system, such as myasthenia gravis or Guillain-Barré syndrome
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. OPDIVO and YERVOY can harm your unborn baby.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if OPDIVO or YERVOY passes into your breast milk. Do not breastfeed during treatment and for 5 months after the last dose of OPDIVO or YERVOY.



Females who are able to become pregnant:

Your healthcare provider should do a pregnancy test before you start receiving OPDIVO or YERVOY.

- You should use an effective method of birth control during your treatment and for at least 5 months after the last dose of OPDIVO or YERVOY. Talk to your healthcare provider about birth control methods that you can use during this time.
- Tell your healthcare provider right away if you become pregnant or think you may be pregnant during treatment with OPDIVO or YERVOY. You or your healthcare provider should contact Bristol Myers Squibb at 1-844-593-7869 as soon as you become aware of a pregnancy.



Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including:

- prescription medicines
- over-the-counter medicines
- vitamins
- herbal supplements
